

MMRC BEGINS REHAB PROCESS

Mumbai: The Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation (MMRC) has just begun the rehabilitation process and recently handed over keys of new houses to 120 families and seven commercial-plus-residential units affected by the Bandra-Kurla Station on the Colaba-Bandra-SEEPZ Metro-3 corridor.

The families have been rehabilitated in a Kurla (west) building.
