023 promises to be a landmarkyearforthecity's transportation sector. The reason: Three Metro lines, Mumbai Trans-Harbour Line (MTHL), BEST's double-decker electric buses, water taxis and new flyovers will open up to Mumbaikars.

For starters, Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) has already completed work on Phase 2 of Line 2A (Dahanukarwadi-D N Nagar) and Line 7 (Aarey to Andheri East).

A senior MMRDA official said, "We are ready to begin commercial runs as soon as we receive approvals from the Commissioner of Metro Rail Safety (CMRS).

Phase I of both these lines (Aarey-Dahisar-Dahanukarwadi) opened in

Metropolitan commissioner SVR Srinivas said, "The opening of these two lines will bring a huge relief to residents of the western suburbs. They will also connect the Metro 1 (Versova-Andheri-Ghatkopar) corridor."

Another line that will be opened up is Phase I of the Metro 3 underground corridor between Aarey and

A senior Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation (MMRC) official said, "We are confident of completing all the major works by July and then trials will begin. We are hopeful of opening the line by December 2023.

Motorists too can expect a smoother ride as another iconic project-Mumbai Trans-Harbour Link Roadis slated to open in a year.

Srinivas said, "At present, almost 86% of the work is complete on the corridor that links Sewri and Nhava Seva.

Likewise, MMRDA will open the SCLR connector that will link LBS Road in the eastern suburbs with Western Express Highway and Chheda Nagar improvement junction.

Among BEST offerings, a new fleet of noiseless, electric double-decker buses will be launched this year. In the first phase, around 50e-buses will

hit the roads from January 14. This will not only augment the carrying capacity and reduce your wait at bus stops, but also fill up the void created by phasing out of several doubledeckers in the past, said BEST general manager Lokesh Chandra.

The existing fleet of 45 diesel-run double-deckers will be phased out completely by June 2023.

Thefirstlotof200double-deckers are being provided by Switch Mobility, which will arrive in the fleet by mid-2023, the first 50 in January. A total of 900 e-double deckers are being procured by BEST on wet lease.
