The Mumbai Metro Rail Corporation (MMRCL) is

the next two weeks," the spokesperson said.

created large facilities like the one at Bandra Kurla Complex (BKC) and NSCI Dome in Worli to augment the bed shortage in the city. The former has some mobile ICU beds, while the
